# 3. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

# Risk advice to man and the environment

Very toxic to aquatic organisms, may cause long-term adverse effects in the aquatic environment.

# 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

# General advice

Remove contaminated clothing immediately and dispose of safely.

#### Inhalation

Move to fresh air. Keep patient warm and at rest. If symptoms persist, call a physician.

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### Skin contact

Wash off immediately with soap and plenty of water. After skin contact: Apply Vitamin E cream or a simple body milk. If symptoms persist, call a physician.

# Eye contact

In the case of contact with eyes, rinse immediately with plenty of water and seek medical advice.

### Ingestion

Do not induce vomiting. Keep at rest. Rinse mouth. Obtain medical attention. Risk of product entering the lungs on vomiting after ingestion.

# **Notes to Physician**

### **Symptoms**

Local:, Skin and eye paraesthesia which may be severe.

# **Symptoms**

Systemic:, dizziness, headache, anorexia, nausea, muscular fasciculation

#### **Risks**

This product contains a pyrethrin.

Must NOT be confused with organophosphorus compounds!

# **Treatment**

Local treatment:

Initial treatment should be symptomatic and supportive.

After eye contact: Instillation of local anaesthetic drops e.g. 1% Amethocaine Hydrochloride eye drops. Give Analgesics as necessary.

### **Treatment**

Systemic treatment:

In the event of a mouthful or more being ingested, the following measures should be considered:

Endotracheal intubation should be done and gastric lavage performed, followed by administration of charcoal.

Monitoring of respiratory and cardiac functions.

Check for pulmonary oedema in event of inhalation.

Against convulsions: give diazepam. For adults 5-10 mg intravenously as necessary until fully sedated; for children 2.5 mg i.v.

There is no specific antidote.

Contraindication: atropine.

Contraindication: derivatives of adrenaline.

Recovery: spontaneous.

# 5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

# Suitable Extinguishing Media

Use water spray, alcohol-resistant foam, dry chemical or carbon dioxide.

# Extinguishing media which must not be used for safety reasons

high volume water jet

# Specific hazards during fire fighting

In case of fire the evolution of dangerous gases is possible.

### Special protective equipment for fire-fighters

In the event of fire and/or explosion do not breathe fumes.

Wear self contained breathing apparatus for fire fighting if necessary.



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### **Further information**

Remove product from areas of fire, or otherwise cool containers with water in order to avoid pressure being built up due to heat.

Whenever possible, contain fire-fighting water by diking area with sand or earth.

# **6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES**

### **Personal Precautions**

Keep people away from and upwind of spill/leak.

Avoid contact with spilled product or contaminated surfaces.

When dealing with a spillage do not eat, drink or smoke.

# **Environmental Precautions**

Do not discharge into the drains/surface water/groundwater.

If spillage enters drains leading to sewage works inform local water company immediately.

If spillage enters rivers or watercourses, inform the Environment Agency (emergency telephone number 0800 807060).

# **Methods for Cleaning Up**

Take up with absorbent material (e.g. sand, diatomaceous earth or a proprietary absorbent material).

Keep in suitable, closed containers for disposal.

Clean floors and contaminated objects with plenty of water.

# 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

# Handling

Advice on safe handling

No specific precautions required when handling unopened packs/containers; follow relevant manual handling advice.

Use only in area provided with appropriate exhaust ventilation.

Advice on protection against fire and explosion

No special precautions required.

# Storage

Requirements for storage areas and containers

Keep containers tightly closed in a cool, well-ventilated place.

Store in a place accessible by authorized persons only.

Keep away from direct sunlight.

Protect against frost.

Storage stability

Storage temperature 0 - 30 °C

Suitable materials

HDPE (high density polyethylene)

# Personal protective equipment

Respiratory Protection No personal respiratory protective equipment normally required.

Respiratory protection should only be used to control residual risk of short duration activities, when all reasonably practicable steps have been taken to reduce exposure at source e.g. containment and/or local extract ventilation. Always follow respirator manufacturer's

instructions regarding wearing and maintenance.

Hand Protection Wear CE Marked (or equivalent) nitrile rubber gloves (minimum

thickness 0,40 mm). Wash when contaminated. Dispose of when contaminated inside, when perforated or when contamination outside cannot be removed. Wash hands always before eating,

drinking, smoking or using the toilet.

Eye protection Wear goggles conforming to EN166 (Field of Use 5 or equivalent).

Skin and body protection Wear standard coverall and Type 6 suit.

Wear two layers of clothing wherever possible. Polyester/cotton or cotton overalls should be worn under chemical protection suit and

should be professionally laundered frequently.

Hygiene measures

When using, do not eat, drink or smoke.

Remove soaked protective clothing immediately.

Remove soiled clothing immediately.

Clean hands and face at work intervals and after work.

Work in an adequately ventilated room.
